CALENDAR ~ 2011

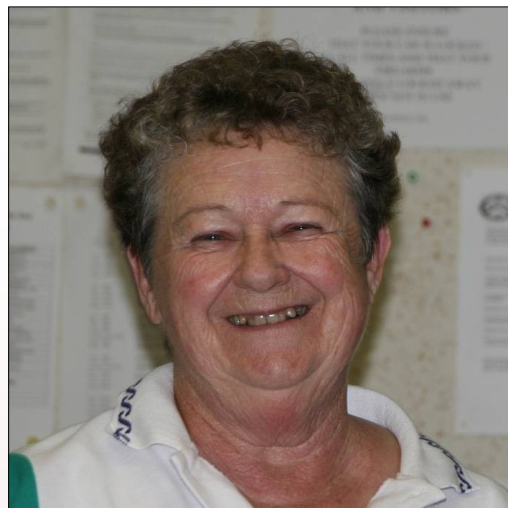
Would all clubs please let me know the dates for prize meetings for next year as soon as possible.

JOKE OF THE MONTH

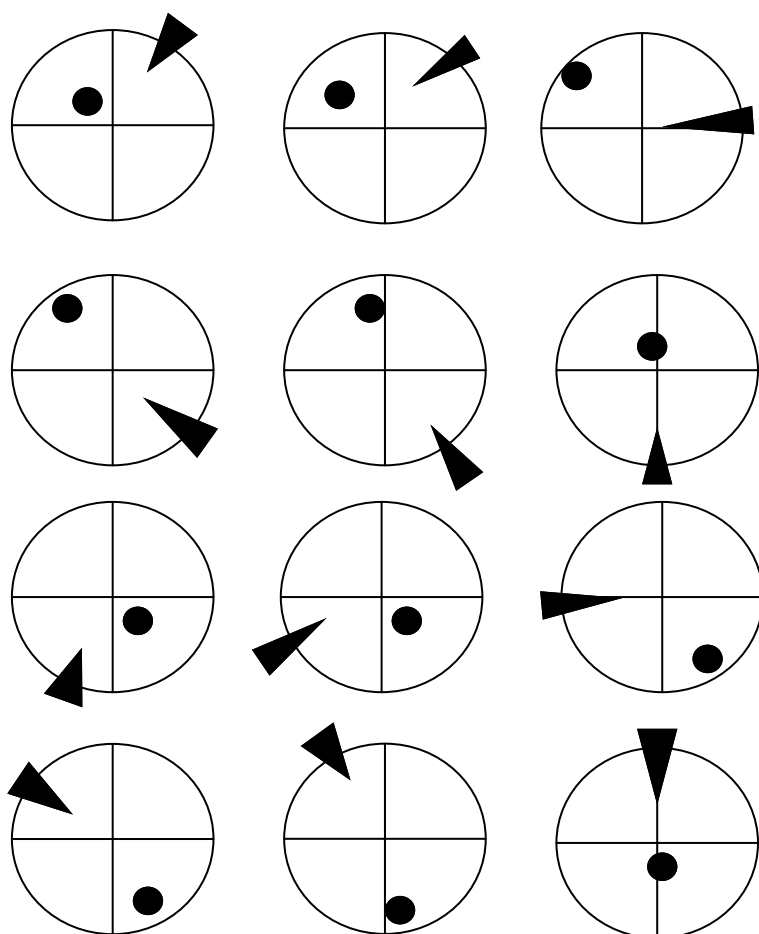
A precious little girl walks into a pet shop and asks, in the sweetest little lisp, between two missing teeth “Excute me mither, do you keep widdle wabbits?”
